The event focused on distributing a small amount of financial support and gifts to the children aiming to foster their educational development. One of Durbar's sister groups, Komal Gandhar, which operates as a sociocultural society, put on a tribunal dance drama performance to commemorate the organization's twenty-eight-year history.

Today in Sonagachi, to mark the 29th Foundation Day of Durbar, a series of functions were organized with a few cultural dance dramas and speeches by a few diligent guest speakers. The Secretary of Durbar, Ms. Bishakha Laskar started the speech by explaining the identity of this organization and the importance of the day by sharing the journey of the sex workers' movement and why the promotion of education is important in those areas. As per her findings, only with education can we change the viewing perspective of

mainstream society about sex workers and their families, so for that, educating our children is important, and that's why today Durbar is providing financial aid and gifts to support the educational development of students of the community who passed the Secondary and Higher Secondary exams in 2023. She also appreciated the performance of the students and blessed them to go ahead in the future.

One of the guest speakers, Dr. Akhter Jawed from Karkinos Health Care Pvt. Ltd. shares the importance of the organization in this place and how, from its inception, it has minimized the problems of the community. Talking about the present condition of Sonagachi, he also assured us that within a few months, his team will start HPV testing and vaccination.

Dipti Lahiri from the All India Democratic Women's Association (AIDWA) highlighted the journey of each student's life who has scored good marks as an 'uneven struggle' in which they are fighting with their own for their establishment in society.

All of the students were inspired by Baban Sidhu, an Assistant Teacher at Delhi Public School in Ruby Park, for their efforts in competing with other students in society and earning good grades. She also wished them well for their future. She also praised them for overcoming all the obstacles on their path to higher education.

Jolanda Romeo, a researcher from the University of Turin, Italy, who is doing a research study in Durbar, also graced the occasion and addressed the gathering by sharing the journey of the marginalized sex worker community by clarifying the differences in the lifestyle of sex workers in India and Italy. She also wished all the students and Durbar for their future betterment.

Piyali Ghosh, Director of Inner Wheel Club Khidderpore Cosmos, engaged in a lively conversation with the present population about how she started her journey with Durbar and how she became a family member of this huge family.

Ronit Bose from Prashanta Banerjee Homeopathic Research Clinic expressed that it is good to hear that a community like this exists and that children are benefiting from this kind of initiative. They would also like to extend their helping hands to them in the near future.

Rabindranath Chakbaborty from the Trade Union Coordination Centre also started his speech by remembering Dr. Smarajit Jana and his thinking to establish this organization, and he also shared the movement and struggling stories of community members.

Mili Das, one of the guest speakers, who is also an international and national awardwinning bilingual poet and writer, shared her own written poem, 'Lojja' where she described the bonding relationship of a sex worker mother with her little child, who is still breastfeeding at the time of finding clients.

All of the present dignitaries congratulated all of the students who had achieved commendable results on their most recent exams. Sixteen students from the Sex Workers' community, eleven students from the Nachni and Jhumur communities, four students from the tribal community, and two from Rahul Vidya Niketan, a residential home for the children of sex workers, have been gifted for their excellence in exams.

Their dedication and hard work were recognized through a small aid of two thousand rupees to help them in admission purposes for further studies; a bag; two notebooks; a pen; and a memento where it was written "Well done, keep it up". Applauding and highlighting their achievements in front of the audience was also a great way to instill confidence and motivation among them and inspire other community members to strive for educational success. Not only were the students' exams celebrated, but all the members of Durbar also celebrated the inception day of their beloved organization by cutting the cake and distributing it to everyone.
